HAPPENINGS

The Street and Utility Department will be driving around town and filling potholes on the roads that will not be included in the paving project that should begin in mid-April or May depending on the opening of asphalt plants this spring. As a reminder the streets and sections of streets are as follows: 21st street from East Street to Main Street, W Walnut Street from 21st Street to State Road 43, 2nd Street from Earl Street to Main Street, 2nd Street from Walnut Street to 450' N of Franklin Street, Main Street from 2nd Street to 4th Street, 4th Street from Walnut Street to Main Street, 4th Street from Earl Street to Main Street, 4th Street from Earl Street to 380' S of Earl Street from Walnut Street to Main Street and 5th Street from Earl Street to 380' S of Earl Street. Please be patient and courteous to the workers as they work to improve our town.

Spring Clean-up will be on Friday April 18, 2025. Rather than doing the clean up by placing dumpsters at the town garage On-Point waste services will be picking up your items at your house. These items are to be placed by the road next to your current trash cart. Each customer shall be allowed 1 large item (mattress & box springs count as 1) and the equivalent of 1 trash cart OR the equivalent of 3 trash carts. There is to be no electrical items, hazardous materials, paint, appliances or items too large for two men to handle.

Park News

It appears that spring has finally sprung which means it is time to get outside and enjoy the fresh air. The park board has been busy planning activities and upgrading our beautiful Park. The park and restrooms will be ready for everyone to use and enjoy on April 1st when the restrooms will begin being open daily. There is also a choice of renting pavilions this year. All reservations require a donation to the park via cash or a check made payable to the Town of Chalmers Park Donation Fund. There are three options to choose from. #1 The large pavilion by the playground which requires a \$35.00 donation. #2 The splash pad pavilion which is smaller than the playground pavilion will be available with a \$25.00 donation or option #3 which is the Splash Pad pavilion, and the use of the kitchen attached for a donation of \$50.00. Please note that when renting pavilions the fees do not include exclusive use of the splash pad or the restrooms attached to the pavilions, these facilities are open to all visitors during park hours. The Splash Pad will open for the season on Memorial Day Weekend weather permitting.
